Professor Brodie has written on U.S. womenâ€™s history and, more recently, nuclear history and secrecy. She is currently completing a book about the Trinity Atomic Bomb Test Siteâ€”where the first atomic bomb was tested in 1945. The book analyzes how the site became a national historical landmark. She has also written on the secrecy surrounding the radiation from the Hiroshima and Nagasaki atomic bombs. Professor Brodie has a Ph.D. in history from the University of Chicago and a B.A. in history from the University of California, Berkeley.
